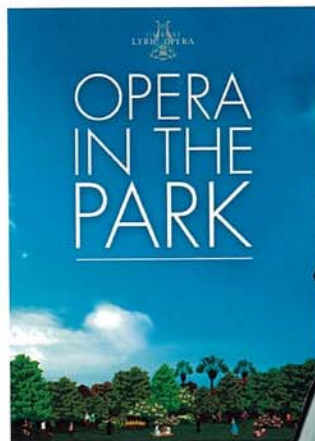


GO RED FOR WOMEN
